

## From Vision to Reality

The original design of the Garden in the late 1980s included most of the beautiful mature trees that are still major elements of the Garden. As indicated on the commemorative wall plaque, Charles Cox was the first parishioner to be interred in the Garden in 1988. A major Memorial Garden Renewal Project, funded entirely by gifts, was completed in 2011. This project enabled the addition of the fountain, benches, mini-lychgates, beautifully crafted birdhouses, the Saint Fiacre terrace and multiple new botanicals. The renewed beauty and serenity of the Garden reflect the parish's dedication to the memory of and reverence for the loved ones interred there.





## The Memorial

**Garden** is the sacred space where ashes of members of the parish, a former member, or a member of his or her family may be interred. A committee composed of the Rector, four members of the Memorial Garden Guild and the Vestry's Chair of Building and Grounds administers the parish's policies and practices with regard to the Garden.




