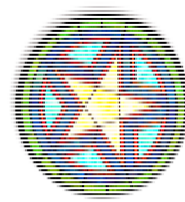

The Exhibit

FIFTY EIGHT PARTICULARLY RARE nativities are displayed in the narthex and gallery of the

church. Half illustrate Jesus' birth as told in the Gospel of Matthew, the other half show the birth as recounted in the Gospel of Luke.

We hope you will enjoy learning why the good news of Christmas was told in two very different New Testament accounts. Hymn and prayer texts, old and new, accompany the crèches. The remaining crèches are displayed in the Parish Hall.

The Crèche Collection

YEARS OF PERSONAL travel and gifts from many friends resulted in Bill Lemonds' collection of over 200 crèches bequeathed to Epiphany. A fascinating mixture of fine art and amateur crafts, the nativity scenes abound in their proclamation of the Messiah's birth. Epiphany adds to this collection each year.

Countries and cultures reflected in the figures include: Mexico, North Georgia, Orthodox Russia, Poland, Polynesia, Renaissance Germany, Renaissance Italy, Southern Appalachia, Taiwan, The West Indies, even a Hollywood film set!

Some of the materials used to create the scenes include: Alaskan mud, balsa, bisque, felt, foil, gourds, paper, mahogany, marble, melted plastic, olive wood, papier-mâché, pewter, straw, Styrofoam, terra cotta, tin, and volcanic ash.
