## Dear Companions in Christ,

In one of my brighter moments, I decided to take a full six weeks off between my departure as Associate Rector of Youth and Young Adult Formation at St. Bartholomew's, Atlanta, and my arrival as Senior Associate Rector at Epiphany. Somewhat tongue-in-cheek, I joked that I gave up church for Lent!

That time was glorious, and also an emotional roller coaster. I took some time to grieve what I had lost in leaving St. Bart's and her people, that community. I took some time to accomplish those house projects that had been lingering...paint the stairwells, fixing that cabinet, going through those boxes. I took some time to read for pure pleasure, and since I hadn't done so before, I read the entire Harry Potter series. I took some time to visit family, and go on vacation. I took some time to just be.

Near the end of those six weeks, the question I was most often asked was "so, are you ready to go back?" Well, yes. And no.

I realized I was wrestling with the question. Was I ready to return to the life and exercise of my ministry as a priest? Absolutely. I missed it, and community, and was thrilled to join Epiphany's staff. But, was this, "going back?" No. So much is different, and while I bring to Epiphany the priesthood I exercised before, I am different, I am changed, I have grown. From my seven years at St. Bart's and even my six weeks of time away from the exercise of this ministry.

As I write this, I think about how we are changed every year as we walk through Holy Week, and the Triduum of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. We will remember all those acts that surrounded Jesus on those sacred days: that last meal, his trial and crucifixion, his death and burial, that scary dark day in the tomb, and his glorious, life-giving, triumphant resurrection!


And we will spend 50 glorious days of Easter getting to know each other, and listening for God's call and how we are meant to be Epiphany together.

God calls us forward. Not to forget where we came from - goodness, no. But to grow in God's light and love with each step ahead, relying on the hope that is within us.

## Good Friday

Good Friday Services are at noon & 6:30 p.m. on Friday, April 3. The Stations of the Cross—a symbolic meditative journey beginning with Christ’s condemnation and ending with his burial—will take place at 11:30 a.m. & 6:00 p.m. Since 1922, the Episcopal Church has contributed the Good Friday Offering to the Episcopal Church in Jerusalem and the Middle East. If you would like to contribute, make a check payable to Epiphany noting “Good Friday” in the memo field.

## Holy Saturday Family Workday

Holy Saturday Family Workday, from 10 a.m. - 12 p.m. Saturday, April 4, includes helping Guilds prepare the Nave for Easter and making crafts for Easter. Sign up your child in the Crossing Hall for ways to help. Because of Spring break beginning this weekend, we especially ask that children sign up for this event this year so we can plan appropriately.

## Easter Vigil

## Altar Flowers & Sanctuary Light Sponsorship

### Altar Flowers

Each Sunday, flowers are placed on the high altar area, with the exception of Lent. There are occasions when the church takes on a more festive look such as Christmas and Easter. Flowers are offered "for the Glory of God and in thanksgiving or in memory of a person or event." Parishioners offer altar flowers as a visible sign of acknowledgement of God's presence in their lives. Make the check payable to Church of the Epiphany for \$70 and note "Flowers" in the memo field. The 2015 calendar signup can be found on the People & Posts page of [epiphany.org](http://epiphany.org). The color and selection of flowers is based on the appropriateness of the liturgical season. More than one person or family may sign up for the altar flowers during the same week.

### Sanctuary Light

The Sanctuary Light is a visible sign of the presence of the Blessed Sacrament held in reserve in the Tabernacle. It is the tradition of our faith that parishioners make an offering to acknowledge the memory of a loved one in his or her life—especially appropriate during the week or day of an anniversary date of someone's death. ## Advocacy Corner


### Georgia General Assembly—Sine Die, April 2

We who advocate wait for “Sine Die,” the end of the legislative session, literally without another day scheduled. Why? We fear mischief of last minute changes in legislation we have supported or opposed as the legislators rush to vote on scores of bills. This year as we go to press we pray for passage of SB 8 Safe Harbor/Rachel's Law Act (services for child victims of sexual exploitation and trafficking and establishment of a Safe Harbor for Sexually Exploited Children Fund) and SR 7 (voters must approve the Fund and its use for assisting sexually exploited children in the general election of 2016).

Decatur's Representative Mary Margaret Oliver worked tirelessly with peers to get a stronger bill than the good bill the Senate passed early in the session. A necessary provision for a real safe harbor is that trafficked youth be treated as victims and not arrested and charged as criminals. Rep. Oliver got that amendment included in the House's SB 8 version. We encourage you to let Rep. Oliver know that we appreciate her expert work on behalf of the trafficked.

Epiphany's Amy Shipp has invited us to participate in a Georgia Cares Domestic Minor Sex Trafficking (DMST) Community Training that will be at Epiphany on April 21 from 9 to 12. This will educate us on the research related to child sex trafficking and will prepare us to spread awareness and teach others. 
**Properly Dispose of Medication at Avondale Estates Police Department**
