Life Together

I am not sure how to define it, or qualify it, or measure it, or say anything teleological about it, but I do know when we have a 'life together.' Which is to say community, or communion, or church, or relationship, or any of the other names we associate with life together, when life together is a good thing. We all know, life together is not such a good thing from time to time, too.

Just a couple of weeks ago, the Vestry went on retreat and I experienced our weekend as a great moment of our life together here at Epiphany. First of all, all of us were present, and someone remarked on the fact that this was the first time in some years when we were all present for retreat. That was a good thing.

We started out talking about mission. What is ours, and whose 'missions' in this life we share did we admire, and what is our own particular mission as individuals at Epiphany? We talked about all this while we talked about finances and passing a balanced budget that meets the demands of our mission. We talked about mission in regard to staff and the changing landscape of personnel. We talked about mission in regard to race, and theology, and our location in Decatur/Atlanta.

We welcomed the new folks and had great delight that Paul Welty took up the challenge of the spirit to respond to the invitation at annual meeting to consider vestry. We teased some of our folks that have discovered vestry to be an integral part of their spiritual journey and have faithfully been a part of the mix in some form or other for the last five years. We expressed appreciation that we could talk candidly and openly and faithfully about the work we have to do and still enjoy what we are doing. We heard some fantastic stories.

We got our work done. We hiked, and rested, and played. We broke bread together and remembered our prayers. We fretted over our community, made plans, articulated some hopes and desires. At the end of a long day on Saturday we concluded our work and took a quick break for a refreshment. We came back to the circle and sat down to finish our game 'two truths and a lie' that goes on all weekend. At the end of that we all just sat for a bit—talking, laughing, continuing to tell more truths than lies and appreciating our life together. We all just sat right there—a very disparate, and united, hard-working, diligent, fun and sad group of people all celebrating our life together.

I could see it. Just there, in that moment it was as clear and beautiful a thing as the church has ever produced in our life together.

Here's to us and seeing that beautiful thing over and over again. Here's to us and giving away that beautiful thing over and over again. Here's to us and our life together.

Endowment Board Grants

Deadline to apply is Tuesday, February 10th

The 30-day period for requesting disbursements from the Epiphany Endowment Fund opened on the day of the annual parish meeting. The guidelines for distributions, pursuant to the Fund's Plan of Operation, are:

Capital improvements, debt reduction, or the building program of The Church of the Epiphany;

Scholarships or grants to members of The Church of the Epiphany for the purpose of attending college, seminary, nursing or medical school; for church-related camping or leadership conferences; or such other training which enables members of this congregation to grow in Christian faith and service to God's people;

Outreach into the community including, but not limited to, grants to Episcopal colleges and seminaries, social service agencies, institutions and agencies to which this parish relates, and to special programs designed for those persons in our area who are in spiritual and/or economic need;

Projects of the Episcopal Church at home and overseas.

The Endowment Board received twelve applications in 2014 for grants totaling \$15,084.15. The Board, with the Vestry's approval, was able to award \$6,566.00. The following represents the total amounts awarded:

- Scholarships awarded - \$1425.00. Two applicants received grants to help with seminary tuition.
- Outreach awarded - \$900.00. Two applicants received grants for support of the Mathew Project and Trinity House.
- Capital Improvements awarded - \$2,790. Three applicants received grants for a Building and Grounds project; Repairs to the Fire Sprinkler system and the acquisition of more folding chairs for parish events and programs

Request forms will be available in the gallery or on the Endowment Board page of the Epiphany website. Deadline for Applications is Tuesday, February 10, 2015. Please return them to the cubby marked Grant Applications outside the parish office.

A Report on the 2015 Budget

First, we want to provide a recap on the 2014 budget. As you know, in 2014, the Vestry passed a “reach” budget in order to fully fund the budget requests from the Outreach and Music ministries. This resulted in a budget that reflected an 11% (or approximately \$70,000) deficiency. This was a leap of faith on the part of your vestry, and as predicted, you responded, and the budget gap was nearly closed by year's end. We ended 2014 with a modest deficit of approximately \$20,000; however, due to a budget surplus from 2013, the deficit was covered, allowing us to start this year with a zero balance.

The Vestry has passed a balanced 2015 budget. We would like to draw your attention to the following notable items:

- a merit-based pay increase for the parish administrator and organist and choirmaster;
- a cost-of-living increase for the Rector;
- a salary package for the new associate rector that is in line with current market trends;

- a salary package for a new assistant rector to be hired by the fourth quarter of 2015;
- an increased budget for the outside sexton services to ensure our building is being properly maintained;
- an increased budget for clergy to attend parish-sponsored retreats, so that the costs not borne by only those participating; and
- an increased budget for Outreach.

We are grateful for the opportunity to use your gifts to fund the mission of the church and strive to do so with the utmost financial integrity.


Domestic Minor Sex Trafficking Lobby Day – February 12, 2015

Matthew Project Update

For us at Epiphany, the Matthew Project is a series of short "mission trips" to Jasper, GA, in support of a Diocesan effort to build a replacement facility for the Good Samaritan Health and Wellness Center. It is a three-year endeavor to build three 4000 sq ft buildings to house the free clinic. Our first trip to Jasper was in April 2014, and we have recently completed our fifth trip!

Building I is almost complete! Projected opening is mid-March. The floor will be installed over the next few weeks, and then they need lots of help with final prep and installation of cabinets. We are planning four "mini-trips": Feb 23/25 (Mon/Tue), Mar 6/7 (Fri/Sat), Mar 9/10 (Mon/Tue), and Mar 13/14 (Fri/Sat). It is not too late for those that have not yet responded to join in. Episcopal Relief and Development (ERD) Project for Lent – Care for Moms and Newborns!

Lent has been the designated time to focus on ERD for many years. We understand that everything we give or do from the heart to help others, no matter the size/amount, is the best kind of gift. This year during Lent at Epiphany our ERD focus will be on aid for "Moms and Newborns." This will be a joint project between Epiphany's Christian Education Program and the Outreach Committee. We appreciate so much the parish response last year to the ERD Ark Project and hope we can be as successful this year on behalf of mothers and newborns.

We're going to collect money in Christian Education classes as well as invite church groups and individuals to donate for the "Moms and Newborns" program from the ERD "Gifts for Life" catalogue. Every \$35 provides the basic medicine and nutrition mothers and newborns need for survival. We have the opportunity to help mothers and newborns around the world live healthier, safer lives through these gifts. We are going to use baby silhouettes to show our progress this year. We will have a display with baby pictures of children at Epiphany at the center; it will be fun to guess identities. (Parents, please email a baby picture of your child to Cindy Bell at cindybell30030@gmail.com or leave a copy with your child's Sunday School teacher or in Kim Finnegan's cubby in the office area if you haven't already.) For every \$35 we collect, a silhouette of a baby will be added to the display. We want the silhouettes to be signs of our desire to help people impacted by poverty worldwide. We hope to have a wall full of babies before we are done!

In Christian Education classes, there will be appropriate containers in the classes for the donations. We ask parishioners to make checks out to Epiphany with ERD on the memo line; checks and cash may be put into the ERD envelopes on the table in the vestibule and then into the collection plates or into Kim Finnegan's cubby.

We will begin this program on the first Sunday of Lent, February 22, and end on Palm Sunday, March 29. We will have a brief celebration of our ERD donations for "Moms and Newborns" program on Palm Sunday between services. Hopefully this program will be a good learning experience for all of us and provide much needed assistance through ERD programs at the same time. Many thanks for your help in making it all happen.
