Hanging out in the offices with whoever shows up. Getting Shea to fix my computer - again. Singing Eucharistic Prayer D on Christmas Eve and Easter Vigil. Collecting roses from the altar flowers and hanging them in my office to dry. Staff meetings (and lunch). Sitting on the floor telling a Godly Play story with the children. Jumble Sale.

Burying the Alleluias on Shrove Tuesday. Gathering Easter eggs. Mary Francis the donkey, on Palm Sunday. Censing the altar with frankincense on High Holy Days. Sitting in the nave in the dark with only the tabernacle candle for light. Sitting in my office with a parishioner. My office. Creating the oratory - little prayer room - with Liefy. Walking into the nave on any day of the week and listening to Julie playing the organ.

Knowing Benno was coming in the door because I could hear him whistling. Holy Week. Sleeping in my office the night of Maundy Thursday during the all-night vigil. Getting to know the sacristy. Designing new vestments and wearing them. Working with the refugee woman from Karin, a weaver, as she designed vestments and wove them for a raffle for Diocesan Convocation. Witnessing one of our parishioners be the highest bidder for those vestments. Walking in procession behind the cross and torches and gospel book, all raised high. Learning how to see how the scripture was the word of the Lord for us today. Learning how to preach. Learning how to be a priest.

Calling our elders and sick who can't come to church. Calling Carmen. Retreats at the farm. Three truths and a lie at Vestry Retreat. Morning Prayer at parish retreat at Kanuga. Eucharist by the lake at Kanuga. Hiking to the Cross at Camp Mikell. The Old Dining Hall at Camp Mikell. Sitting in the nursery talking to Jean and parents with the children all around, playing. Vacation Bible School, every one of them. Building fairy huts in the side yard (now Memorial Garden). Holy Saturday workday with the children. Standing in the Gallery after church with everybody there. Writing prayers. Evensong. The Hildegard Ensemble. The Epiphany Choir. The prayer desk. Sitting on the pew in prayer under the tabernacle candle. The healing desk with anointing oil. My birthday lunch with Sabra. The swirl of angels and animals at Epiphany pageant.

Coffee hour. The basement classroom. Inquirers and Co nfirmation Class. Our life maps. Planting strawberries in the playground

garden beds with children on Wednesday nights in Lent. The Hunger Walk on a spring day. The Pride March in the rain. The MLK march in the freezing cold. Recycling and composting (or trying to). Making a cross out of garbage we found on our Urban Clean Up on Dekalb Avenue for Green Sunday. Earth Guild meetings when we read our favorite nature poems, talked about awe, where we dreamed up a new heaven and a new earth and spread out maps of Atlanta creeks. Reverencing the altar in the final procession at the end of a service. Saying thank you to God for this opportunity to serve you.

Endowment Board Grants

The 30-day period for requesting disbursements from the Epiphany Endowment Fund opens on the day of the annual parish meeting. The guidelines for distributions, pursuant to the Fund's Plan of Operation, are:

Capital improvements, debt reduction, or the building program of The Church of the Epiphany;

Scholarships or grants to members of The Church of the Epiphany for the purpose of attending college, seminary, nursing or medical school; for churchrelated camping or leadership conferences; or such other training which enables members of this congregation to grow in Christian faith and service to God's people;

Outreach into the community including, but not limited to, grants to Episcopal colleges and seminaries, social service agencies, institutions and agencies to which this parish relates, and to special programs designed for those persons in our area who are in spiritual and/or economic need;

Projects of the Episcopal Church at home and overseas.

The Endowment Board received twelve applications in 2014 for grants totaling \$15,084.15. The Board, with the Vestry's approval, was able to award \$6,566.00. The following represents the total amounts awarded:

- Scholarships awarded \$1425.00. Two applicants received grants to help with seminary tuition.
- Outreach awarded \$900.00. Two applicants received grants for support of the Mathew Project and Trinity House.
- Capital Improvements awarded \$2,790. Three applicants received grants for a Building and Grounds project; Repairs to the Fire Sprinkler system and the acquisition of more folding chairs for parish events and programs

What do we do while in Haiti?

We get to know Haiti, BTI, each other and ourselves.

We pray, worship and give thanks.

We eat together, swim, talk and learn.

We give seminars based on our daily work and passions. We listen and encourage.

We are present with our Haitian brothers and sisters.

What is BTI?

BTI provides education that changes lives. BTI graduates work at the cutting edge of innovative business technology developing new approaches to address Haiti's needs. BTI has a two-fold mission. The first is to provide students in Southwestern Haiti with the opportunity to achieve a highquality, American-style, university-level education without being forced to leave their families and homes in this region. BTI also strives to support the economic development of Les Caves and the surrounding areas by providing skilled employees for existing businesses and by supporting entrepreneurial graduates in starting and successfully operating small businesses.

Since its inception in 2005, BTI has produced 653 skilled graduates, of which more than 60% are employed in fields such as banking, government administration and non-profit organization management. In this school year, BTI has enrolled almost 540 students and anticipates a graduating class of 125. Seventy percent of BTI students are female.


Why Epiphany?

After almost a year of research, during which we visited Haiti, discerned, conversed, formed relationships and planned, Epiphany became BTI's partner in 2009.
