## Wine and Jesus

I loved waiting tables. For most of my young adult life, until I entered seminary, I waited tables. I started “slinging seafood” in the summers in a shack near Myrtle Beach, then moved to upscale dining on Cape Cod where a humorous co-worker - in moments of great anxiety over a busy kitchen - would pick up the cheese tray and walk through the bustling dining room singing “What a friend we have in cheeses...” Then, in Highlands, North Carolina, I worked at Wolfgang’s on Main, where I was required to wear a tie and had a business card and clientele that would not only make a reservation at the restaurant but would reserve one of my tables for a “personalized dining experience,” as ridiculous as that may sound.

I think ultimately the thing I liked most about waiting tables was that it was usually a second job to supplement my less than lucrative non-profit careers. HIV/AIDS work sustained my heart and soul, but I loved the balance with serving food at night. During the day I would be deeply embedded in helping folks understand a fatal disease and assist the poorly educated through the maze of social security applications. But at night, my primary concern was to make sure someone had enough napkins as they navigated a messy shrimp boil, or to be sure a glass of wine was never more than half empty.

It was the balance that served me well. The rhythm for this extrovert. When I would be exhausted from a day of paperwork, being in a social setting with a lot of people renewed me. And yet, the importance of life-giving work and making a difference during the day was balanced with the hope of how life goes on, and anxiety about food and beverage reminded me not to take myself too seriously all the time.

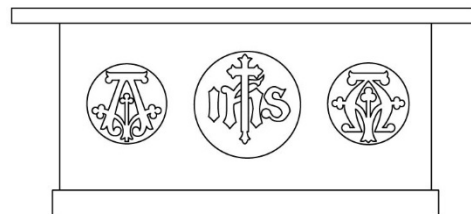
A balanced faith is like this - renewing and reinvigorating and serious and giving and joyful. In fact, it has an official fancy name (we are Episcopalians, of course!): The Renewal-Apostolate Cycle.

The Renewal - Apostolate Cycle is a way of describing a central dynamic of Christian life. The Cycle focuses our attention on the Christian’s movement between being renewed in baptismal identity and purpose and living as instruments of God’s love and grace in daily life.

We gather together as a community, around God’s table, to be nourished and renewed. To be reminded of our purpose to seek and serve Christ in all people, and then we are called to go and do just that in each day, in a variety of ways. Think of it like this: when you come to the table, the weekly reminder of your baptismal call, you receive the body and blood of Christ, integrated into you - your very being - to go and be Christ in the world. It is a cycle. We need both.

May your Christian scale be balanced,

## Epiphany's Art Ministry welcomes Patty Young as our artist for July

### Artists Bio:

I am an acrylic painter and collage artist. My inspiration comes from the human form, nature, and color. I paint both naturalistically and in the abstract. For the



latter, I am interested in abstractions that suggest natural themes and those that I compose with geometric shapes and patterns. I collage with paper that usually comes from my previous work. My finished pieces are painted on canvases with a wrapped edge and range in size from 6 inch square to 30 inches by 40 inches.

I initially studied design at the University of Wisconsin, Milwaukee. At the time, however, I found that art demanded a total commitment and I was unwilling to reveal as much of myself as was required. So, while not involved with art in a formal way, I found myself busy with many craft forms such as sewing, knitting, jewelry making, assemblage, and needlework. Ultimately I found the courage to seriously pursue painting and, in 2012, began taking classes in acrylic painting at the Spruill Center in Atlanta.

## Confirmation Class

Per the Catechism in the Prayer Book:

What is Confirmation? Confirmation is the rite in which we express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop.

What is required of those to be confirmed? It is required of those to be confirmed that they have been baptized, are *sufficiently instructed in the Christian Faith*, are penitent for their sins, and are ready to affirm their confession of Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.

Confirmation classes will begin on Wednesday, August 26, and meet weekly until December 9, from 6:30-8:00 p.m., concluding with Compline. This class will be offered simultaneously with the Bible study class. Benno and Sharon will share both of these classes, alternating between the two.

Confirmation is open to any adult or youth seeking to know more about the Christian faith as the Episcopal Church has received it. We will discuss prayer, scripture, church history, sin and redemption, ethics, the BCP, worship and liturgy, the three-legged stool (tradition, scripture and reason), and more!

If, at the end, you desire to be confirmed and affirm your faith, we will participate in diocesan confirmation on Sunday, December 13, at 4 p.m. at the Cathedral of St. Philip.

## Refugee Family Update

Our new family are Orthodox Christians who fled Ethiopia because of religious persecution. They fled to Uganda six years ago shortly after the birth of their youngest child, Alem. The family is very thankful to be in the US and able to start anew. The family members are Tsehay, the father, who is a priest and his wife is Mulu. Tsehay and Mulu arrived with their children – two sons and a daughter. Mengistu, who has a degree in Electrical Engineering from a college in Uganda, is their eldest son. Sondzelalem, the younger son, will be entering the 11th grade, and their youngest child, a daughter, Alem, is six and will be starting school in August. The children speak very good English and the parents can understand some English. We hope to have them as our guests at church in the near future.

organization. Our bylaws prohibit us from raising funds. Contact: Shirley Sugden, 404.373.4885

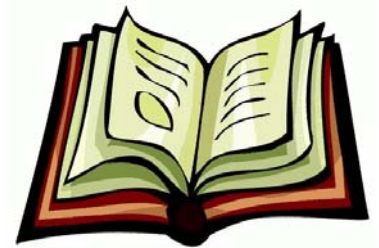
### Epiphany Book Club
