Do Something

Mrs. Mikolajczyk was my eleventh-grade English teacher. Looking back over all the years of being a student, she still rises pretty close to the top of the list of most influential teachers to me. English was never my favorite subject, until Mrs. Mikolajczyk (pronounced Mike-oh-low-jack), not only because she taught English well, but also because she taught life well. In one of her more shocking moments, I remember her telling our honors class - "you should spend a day in detention if you haven't ever done so...it will teach you things about life now, before the real world has far more dire consequences..."

But maybe my favorite thing she taught was this: "If you are stuck, do something. If you need to write a paper, just start writing something, and you will find your way to where you need to be." For a self-proclaimed perfectionist - and one who has had her fair share of meeting deadlines - this has saved me more times than I can possibly tell you.

For instance, writing newsletter covers this often is new to me. And in an effort to "get it right" (yes, I know that sounds ridiculous), the perfectionist in me was becoming more and more stuck, more paralyzed. So, I did something. I sat down with the readings from the daily office, and today's gospel reading is from Luke - the familiar parable we often hear referred to as the prodigal son. It was like God just gave it right to me - one of my favorite bible stories of all times.

If you haven't read the parable of the prodigal son lately, I commend it to you again: Luke 15:11-32. And further, I also commend to you a book: *The Return of the Prodigal Son: A Story of Homecoming* by Henri Nouwen. Barbara Ryder reminded me of this treasure recently, as she is using it for a time in the Wednesday afternoon bible study group.

Nouwen uses Rembrandt's artwork by the same name as his guide for meditating on the parable. It is a story of reconciliation, and affirmation, and homecoming. Nouwen takes his reader through every character in the painting, and how each one is God or relates to God. The heart strings are stirred to catch a glimpse of what it might be like to love as God loves, and to know the love God gives. All in an effort to reconcile.

As we liturgically move out of the Easter season, our public confession will return to our liturgies. We move into ordinary time, and the rhythm of worship will become very familiar. As we move into summer, many will travel or vacation, returning "home" at some point or another. Always, God is calling us back, reconciling us to God. It doesn't have to be perfect, thanks be to God. But if you are stuck in reconciling with God, with a friend, with yourself...do something. It is a start.

Altar Flowers

Each Sunday, with the exception of Lent, flowers are placed on the high altar area. There are occasions when the church takes on a more festive look such as Christmas and Easter. Flowers are offered "for the Glory of God and in thanksgiving or in memory of a person or event." Parishioners offer altar flowers as a visible sign of acknowledgement of God's presence in their lives. Make your check payable to Church of the Epiphany for \$70 and note "Flowers" in the memo field. The 2015 calendar signup can be found on the People & Posts page of epiphany.org. The color and selection of flowers is based on the appropriateness of the liturgical season. More than one person or family may sign up for the altar flowers during the same week.

Sanctuary Light

The Sanctuary Light is a visible sign of the presence of the Blessed Sacrament held in reserve in the Tabernacle. It is the tradition of our faith that parishioners make an offering to acknowledge the memory of a loved one in his or her life—especially appropriate during the week or day of an anniversary date of someone's death. Advocacy Corner

Support the Green Climate Fund

The drastic impacts of climate change are evident across the globe. Coastal erosion, tremendous hurricanes, severe heat waves, and prolonged droughts often most harshly impact our vulnerable communities: the poor, the homeless, the elderly, and the young. Addressing climate change is a moral challenge of our generation.

Fortunately, the international community has launched a Green Climate Fund (GCF) that will help vulnerable countries to reduce their carbon emissions and to adapt to the devastating impacts of climate change. This initiative relies on the cooperation and financial backing of participating states, and the U.S. has a particularly critical role to play in funding this effort. For Fiscal Year 2016, President Obama has requested \$500 million from U.S. Congress to help establish the GCF.

Episcopal Church policy urges the President and Congress to provide financial support and leadership for developing nations to control their emissions of greenhouse gases in order to reduce their vulnerability to climate change. Please call on your members of Congress today and ask them to fully fund the President's request!
