Seasons

Mary McKenzie died last week. Wister Cook wasn't long before that. Of course there are others. And I have to say that it has been difficult for me. I have been around Epiphany long enough to feel like everyone else will too. But as we know, death is a part of life.

I was talking with a group of people many years ago about the seasons of the church and asking questions about the particular season we were in, and a participant said, "I don't feel it, I don't feel Lent right now. I feel Lent in the spring when my mother died." Hm. My first reaction, of course, was to wonder whether or not that was good, to feel the 'seasons' of the church out of season. My second reaction was "thank God for that."

I felt a sense of relief because it was dawning on me that I too felt Lent out of season. I feel Lent most acutely in the fall, the season of my Dad's death. Just this past week the staff were joking about singing Eucharist a la a Barber Shop Quartet, and we tried a few riffs and laughed and laughed. An Easter moment to be sure. Sharon and the B's was the name we came up with.

We will have an Easter moment this Saturday as we celebrate Mary's life with us, as we did with Wister, and Doug and Charles all just since the Holidays. So let yourself feel it when it happens, Lent: penitence and contemplation of your mortality, and making amendment of life; Advent: waiting and looking for Jesus, and hoping and working at doing justice and loving mercy; Pentecost: the rush of the Spirit; Ordinary time: the workaday work of living life; and yes, finally Easter: a resurrection, a new life, the turning of the earth towards light and life.

Feel it when it happens, love it in the moment, whatever season you find yourself in. That's why we practice it all the time to be ready for it whenever it comes.



Lent Programs & Services

offered as usual in the Nave. On Wednesdays, evening programs go on as usual.

Episcopal Relief and Development (ERD) Project for **Lent – Community Gardens!**

Lent has been the designated time to focus on ERD for many years. We understand that everything we give or do from the heart to help others, no matter the size/amount, is the best kind of gift. This year, in keeping with our Lenten theme of sustainability, our ERD focus will be on community gardens. This will be a joint project between Christian Education and Outreach. We appreciate so much the parish response last year to the ERD Mothers and Newborns project and hope we can be as successful this year on behalf of communities all over the world.

We're going to collect money in Christian Education classes as well as invite church groups and individuals to donate for the community gardens program from the "Gifts for Life" catalogue. Every \$35 provides an individual share of a community garden. We have the

opportunity to help communities around the world become more sustainable through these gifts. In Christian Education classes, there will be appropriate containers in the classes for the donations. For every \$35 we collect, a plant will be added to the bulletin board in the gallery. We hope to have a full garden before we are done!

Of course we will also accept donations from the congregation at large. Checks and cash may be put into the ERD envelopes in the vestibule and then into the collection plates. Checks should be made out to Epiphany with ERD on the memo line.

We will begin this program on the first Sunday of Lent, February 14, and end on Palm Sunday, March 20. Hopefully this program will be a good learning experience for all of us and provide much needed assistance through ERD programs at the same time. Many thanks for your help in making it all happen.

Maundy Thursday

Thursday, March 24, at 6:15 p.m.

Maundy Thursday, also known as Holy Thursday, commemorates the Last Supper when Jesus shared the Passover meal with his disciples on the night before he was crucified. Epiphany has a long-held tradition of celebrating this special day beginning with a simple and communal Agápe supper, followed by a procession into the Church to strip the altar and reserve the blessed bread and wine, body and blood of Iesus.

No recipes have come down to us from the time of Christ; however, knowing what raw materials were available to the Jews of Palestine in that period and what dishes were mentioned in the Bible, we have an idea of what Christians may have eaten at an Agápe (love) feast. Dried and fresh fruits (no citrus as oranges and lemons were rare and very expensive), olives, almonds, different kinds of cheeses, lentils, cucumbers with yogurt, couscous, tabbouleh, hummus and bread could have been a part of these meals. For the bread, flatbread, pita, or matzoth (or all three) might have been eaten. Wine for the adults (and grape juice for the children at our supper) would be the custom.

As part of our liturgical expression of this event, we invite participants to bring to their 'assigned' table one of the components listed above while Joel Fowler prepares a delicate fish fillet for those who are interested. As we eat, we will do the liturgy of the Word, make Eucharist around our tables, and humble ourselves to our neighbors by the washing of each other's feet for those who wish to participate.

Sign-up sheets for tables are located outside the kitchen in Jones Hall. Your food offering is designated on the sign-up sheet. No charge for fish this year, but please indicate if you want a serving so we have a count. The nursery will be available for infants and toddlers, if parents wish to use it. Older children are seated with their families and are encouraged to attend.

Watch One Hour

Our traditional vigil on Maundy Thursday night and Good Friday morning is an opportunity for people to come to the church in response to Jesus's question in the Garden of Gethsemane, "Could you not keep awake one hour?" A time for prayer, meditation and scripture reading, the vigil hours mark the time between the Last Supper and Jesus's crucifixion. Vigil keepers are invited to pray near the altar of repose, in the baptistry, where the reserved sacrament is kept during this time. Please

Good Friday Services are at noon & 7 p.m. on Friday, March 25. The Stations of the Cross—a symbolic meditative journey beginning with Christ's condemnation and ending with his burial—will take place at 11:30 a.m. & 6:30 p.m. Since 1922, the Episcopal Church has contributed the Good Friday Offering to the Episcopal Church in Jerusalem and the Middle East. Epiphany will have one team (Epiphany Magi) jointly sponsored by our Youth and the Outreach Committee. We will walk/run to raise money for the Food Bank and Epiphany's feeding ministries (Peachtree Pine, Holy Comforter, Emmaus House, and Hagar's House). Our Epiphany Food Pantry receives a credit at the Food Bank for 80% of the funds raised (which last year was \$2540!). These funds are a major help in allowing us to serve the underserved!

Church of the Common Ground Ministry

The Church of the Common Ground is a worshipping community of the Episcopal



Diocese of Atlanta which provides support for the spiritual, social, emotional, and physical needs of Atlanta's unhoused men and women. Over the last year, Epiphanites have been helping with the foot washing ministry of this program by providing weekly lunches for the seven unhoused members of Common Ground who work with this ministry and by washing weekly the towels for this ministry. This spring we will need to find one new lunch provider and a new towel washer. Please read the descriptions below for details:

Provide Lunches: Four people provide lunches for the seven unhoused members of the foot washing committee. This means each person makes seven lunches once a month. Lunch makers provide: hearty meat/cheese sandwiches, fresh fruit, and dessert. They assemble the lunches at Epiphany on Sunday, where bags, napkins, and chips are provided. Lunches are put into one main bag (also provided) and left in the refrigerator at church by 4 p.m. on Sundays. There are Outreach funds to reimburse expenses. The feedback we get on how much the men and women enjoyed the lunches always makes us know our efforts are worth the trouble.

Wash Towels: The Rev. Mary Wetzel, Vicar of the Church of the Common Ground, leaves the towels (one load) at church in a specified place after the foot washing (Mondays in cold weather, Tuesday in warm weather). The person washing the towels picks them up, takes them home to wash, and returns them before the next foot washing. There are also machines available at church if you would rather wash, dry, and fold them there.

These contributions are small but extremely helpful to the Rev. Wetzel. She is always very appreciative of our efforts. If you might be able to help with either of these needs, please contact Cindy Bell at 404.549.3363
