## Summertime and the Long Green Season

We made it! For some, that means we made it to summer and warmer weather. For some, it means we made it to the end of the school year and summer break. For some, it might even mean graduating from high school or college, or something else. Whatever it is, many of us are celebrating the end of something and the beginning of something else.

Liturgically, we made it to what we affectionately call the long green season. See, we came through the 40 days of Lent, then Holy Week, the 50 days of Easter, then Pentecost. Now we enter Ordinary Time. This season began the Monday after Pentecost Sunday (May 16) and will continue until the first Sunday in Advent (November 27). Additionally, the color of vestments and church hangings used for this season is green. Thus—*the long green season*.

During the summer around Epiphany, our formal formation and education classes take a break. This is, of course, because many people travel over the summer, but also to give our awesome teachers (who are all volunteer!) a much-needed break.

There are some things you can do during the summer to continue your own formation, and to stay connected to the community—whether you will be in Sunday church or not.

One idea is to read the collect—the prayer that collects us together—the weekdays between services. You can find them easily at this link: <http://www.lectionarypage.net/>

Additionally, on each Sunday—you can also find the scripture texts we will be reading. One idea is to look at the lessons on a whole for a month, or maybe even the summer, and read the whole story at different intervals, so you can sort of “keep up” with the scripture part of that three-legged stool that we as Anglicans like to talk about. For instance, you may notice that for the next three months—June/July/August—we will read from the Gospel of Luke, chapters 7-14. Now, while we may not want to have summer homework, I’m going to recommend you read them all as a whole.

Remember the biblical stories were not told in the fits and starts that we hear them each week, but as an entire story—and probably really quickly too! With great anticipation for what might come next!

No matter where your summer travels take you, know that the church remains faithful in mission and ministry, in worship and prayer.

## Four Emmaus House Interns to live at Byrd House this summer

Emmaus House is the site of a summer Children's Defense Fund (CDF) Freedom Schools® program, serving 100 neighborhood scholars, grades K-8, with an innovative integrated reading curriculum and enrichment focused on preventing the "summer slide" in grade-level reading. Twelve college-age young people and recent college graduates play a key role in the program as servant leader interns. The interns work as facilitators in the classroom and are responsible for the front-line care and nurturing of the children. This summer four interns will be living at the Byrd House during their service at Emmaus House. They are:

- Aria Betts, from California, who is currently working on her Masters in Education at the University of California, Berkeley;
- Gabriel Johnson, from Villa Rica, GA, a Bonner Scholar who recently received his B.A. in sociology from Maryville College;
- Branden Rodriguez, from Florida, an English major and rising junior at Emory University; and
- Jennifer Marshall, from Arkansas, a public health and education major and rising senior at Agnes Scott College.



As director of education services at Emmaus House, I am extremely grateful for Epiphany's generosity in allowing these interns to live at the Byrd House in June and July. I hope the parish will have the opportunity to get to know these young leaders over the summer.

## Altar Arrangements & Sanctuary Light

### Altar Flowers

Each Sunday, with the exception of Lent, flowers are placed on the high altar area. There are occasions when the church takes on a more festive look such as Christmas and Easter. Flowers are offered "for the Glory of God and in thanksgiving or in memory of a person or event." Parishioners offer altar flowers as a visible sign of acknowledgement of God's presence in their lives. The color and selection of flowers is based on the appropriateness of the liturgical season. More than one person or family may sign up for the altar flowers during the same week.

### Sanctuary Light

The Sanctuary Light is a visible sign of the presence of the Blessed Sacrament held in reserve in the Tabernacle. It is the tradition of our faith that parishioners make an offering to acknowledge the memory of a loved one in his or her life—especially appropriate during the week or day of an anniversary date of someone's death.
