All Hallows Eve—All Saints’—All Souls’

So a little guy up at Kanuga recognized me as we all were settling in for the Parish Retreat. He asked his parent ‘is that Father Benno’? And the parent confirmed the sighting. Then the child asked, ‘does that mean this is church’?

What a great revelation! Where ever we are, whenever we gather we are church. And we gather as living, breathing sacrament that all the world is a holy place, all people are holy embodiment of the divine. That is actually what a priest’s work is all about, that is we simply point out, or bless or consecrate (fancy terms for ‘point out’), most simply through presence that all places, all times, all people are hallowed even when it’s hard to recognize, and sometimes ‘its’ a priest.

We are gathering on November 6th to be church, to remember church, to point out holy space and place and time, to tell sacred stories about who made us church and how we miss them, or that place and time that formed us and strengthened us and helped us to flourish. We are gathering on November 6th, the day of All Saints’ and later that evening the festival of All Souls’ to shout out, and reverence in quietude the remarkable journey we’ve been on as God’s people so that we might continue on that journey to talk about the good news that all people are holy people, that all places are holy places, that where ever we go there goes the body, the church, the Jesus we just might have the good fortune to meet if we pause for a moment to point out, to consecrate to bless the moments we are given with each other to love and laugh and weep and mend and break open and point out that God is near, that the kingdom is at hand, that joy has sprung up in our land, on our point, in the courtyard, at the altar, in the graveyard, on retreat, out in the woods and the marketplace and on the highway, and in the school and at home.

We are gathering the Saints on November 6th at 5:00 p.m. with all this sacred story, bring it with you to this particular place and time, a memento, a story, a scrap of cloth, an old coat your father wore, or the brooch your grandmother gave to your mother and now has been given to you. Bring yourselves, your beautiful, holy, broken, perfect self. At 5:00 in the evening we will point out that we are God’s and God is ours and we have good work to do. We will feast and toast and celebrate and remember and plan and dream dreams. We are church. Wherever we are, whenever we are, we are that body that God has consecrated, blessed pointed out to go on loving, and making peace and restoring the dignity to the world.

We are the Saints’. We are the body. We are church.

UPDATE: Haiti Hurricane Matthew Relief

Thanks to your generosity, Epiphany has sent almost \$12,000 to BTI, through bank wire transfers. Since 2009, we have enjoyed a personal parish relationship and mission work with the Bishop Tharp Institute (BTI), a college of the Diocese of Haiti. BTI lost roofs, incurred damage to classrooms and equipment. Also, the roof was lost on the Episcopal Church of the Ascension at which Rev. Kesner Ajax is the Rector.



Thankfully work is now underway to help those impacted by the hurricane. BTI students and Ascension parishioners are being fed. Classes have resumed at BTI. Equipment is being replaced. BTI's Epiphany Guest House is housing aid workers. The need is still great and recovery will take many months. We ask that if you wish to donate relief funds, please make your check out to Epiphany noting BTI in the memo field.

Tour of Ranglin Biofeedstocks, LLC



October 29: Phillip Ranglin, a member of the Earth Guild, has invited us on a tour of his composting company, Ranglin Biofeedstocks, LLC on Saturday, October 29, beginning at 11 a.m. Not only does he have regular and earthworm composting, he also has a container garden for growing vegetables, including corn, beans, etc., and he has a green house on the property.

Phillip uses solar power; he also has a backup generator if he needs it but hasn't yet. He harvests rainwater in a 250-gallon tote, and uses a gray water recycling system to water the plants in his container garden.

An environmental microbiologist by training, Phillip has always been an advocate for the environment. His small business originally started with the intention of pure algae farming, but the composting element came into being when he noticed a lack of sustainably-sourced carbon dioxide and decided to use organic waste materials as the source of that raw material. He uses a patent pending process to trap as much carbon dioxide as possible, keeping it out of the atmosphere.

Veterans Recognition

Sunday, November 13

We will recognize the Veterans in our parish on Sunday, November 13. If you have not *previously* told us so, please let the office know (parishadmin@epiphany.org) the military branch and campaigns that you served by Wednesday, November 9, in order to be included in the bulletin.

Veterans Day is observed on November 11. November 11 was chosen as the official date for Veterans Day in reference to the ending of World War I. Germany signed an armistice with



the Allies that signaled the end of the war at 11 a.m. on 11 November 1918. Originally known as Armistice Day, the holiday became Veterans Day in 1954.

Recycling at Epiphany

We take advantage of DeKalb County Recycling's residential pickup service, and have receptacles around the parish for paper, and then receptacles for plastic and cardboard in the kitchen.

Glass recycling, however, is another matter. DeKalb County does not recycle glass. However, Epiphany is still willing to do it, but you need to be sure that you put glass in a **separate blue bucket in the kitchen**, and at least once a month, or when a container is full, staff or members of the recycling crew will take it to the Farmer's Market or to their homes in Decatur, where glass curb recycling does happen.

Volunteer: We have a small but loyal crew of volunteers who come Sunday after church or Monday mornings and go around the church, collect everything and take it to the curb for pickup by noon. It would be nice to have a couple more people on the rotation, so if you'd like to help with this behind-the-scenes ministry, you can sign up at <http://www.epiphany.org/ministries/people.html>

Other Recycling: We also have small containers on the kitchen counter to recycle your batteries and natural corks. This is taken care of by members of the Earth Guild, which also hosts a couple of electronic recycling events a year. Altar Flowers

Each Sunday, with the exception of Lent, flowers are placed on the high altar area. There are occasions when the church takes on a more festive look such as Christmas and Easter. Flowers are offered “for the Glory of God and in thanksgiving or in memory of a person or event.” Parishioners offer altar flowers as a visible sign of acknowledgement of God’s presence in their lives. The color and selection of flowers is based on the appropriateness of the liturgical season. More than one person or family may sign up for the altar flowers during the same week.

Sanctuary Light

The Sanctuary Light is a visible sign of the presence of the Blessed Sacrament held in reserve in the Tabernacle. It is the tradition of our faith that parishioners make an offering to acknowledge the memory of a loved one in his or her life—especially appropriate during the week or day of an anniversary date of someone’s death.
