A Final Affairs Fair

There is a rubric in the Book of Common Prayer on page 442 that reads:

The Minister of the Congregation is directed to instruct the people, from time to time, about the duty of Christian parents to make prudent provision for the well-being of their families, and of all persons to make wills, while they are in health, arranging for the disposal of their temporal goods, not neglecting, if they are able, to leave bequests for religious and charitable uses.

A Final Affairs Fair is an event to help parishioners think about the importance of planning for the end of life. It is similar to a ministry fair, with resource people available to share information and expertise on specific issues. Participants have the opportunity to ask questions, take home relevant information, and arrange follow-up appointments if desired. (ecfvp.org)

Confirmation Classes begin September 25

Per the Catechism in the Prayer Book: What is Confirmation?

Confirmation is the rite in which we express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop.

What is required of those to be confirmed? It is required of those to be confirmed that they have been baptized, are sufficiently instructed in the Christian Faith, are penitent for their sins, and are ready to affirm their confession of Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.

Confirmation classes will be held on Sunday afternoons from 1 – 3 p.m. for four consecutive weeks beginning September 25 until October 16.

Confirmation is open to any adult or youth seeking to know more about the Christian faith as the Episcopal Church has received it. We will discuss prayer, scripture, church history, sin and redemption, ethics, the BCP, worship and liturgy, the three-legged stool (tradition, scripture and reason), and more!

We will discuss options for being confirmed near the end of our time together.

Altar Arrangements & Sanctuary Light

Altar Flowers

Each Sunday, with the exception of Lent, flowers are placed on the high altar area. There are occasions when the church takes on a more festive look such as Christmas and Easter. Flowers are offered “for the Glory of God and in thanksgiving or in memory of a person or event.” Parishioners offer altar flowers as a visible sign of acknowledgement of God’s presence in their lives. The color and selection of flowers is based on the appropriateness of the liturgical season. More than one person or family may sign up for the altar flowers during the same week.



Sanctuary Light

The Sanctuary Light is a visible sign of the presence of the Blessed Sacrament held in reserve in the Tabernacle. It is the tradition of our faith that parishioners make an offering to acknowledge the memory of a loved one in his or her life—especially appropriate during the week or day of an anniversary date of someone’s death.

Children’s Choir

Our choir year for children and youth begins September 20 and 21. If you plan on having your children participate, please respond to music@epiphany.org with your child’s name, age, and grade in school. Registration forms may be filled out on the first day of rehearsal; all rehearsals take place in the music suite upstairs; parents are asked to bring children to the music suite and come back at dismissal. Information about each choir follows:

Beginning Choristers is an entry-level musical experience for children in pre-K (age 4) to Kindergarten. Children will develop elementary music and choral skills through games, singing, and activities. Rehearsals are Tuesdays from 5:00-5:30 p.m., **beginning September 20**.

Intermediate Choristers is for children who are in 1st and 2nd grades and continues where Beginning Choristers ends. This choir forms very basic foundations in musical literacy, good singing skills and more time for children to prepare themselves to truly lead in worship. Rehearsals are on Tuesday afternoons from 5:30-6:00 p.m., **beginning September 20**.

Junior Choir is our children’s treble choir for those in grades 3 through unchanged voices. Members of this choir learn and expand on their knowledge of the rudiments of music and continue to develop their singing voices. These choristers explore their ability to sight-sing, and emphasis in rehearsals is on music and liturgy education. Basic English handbell ringing will also take place periodically. This choir sings in church once each month. Rehearsals are on Wednesdays from 5:00-5:45 p.m., **beginning September 21**.

Wednesday Nights Dinner

Dinner served from 5:30-6:30 p.m. Cost is \$7.50 for adults, \$4 for children 10 and under. This year we are offering Boxed meals or Pasta and Salad from Jason’s Deli. Education for Ministry

Education for Ministry is a group designed to help you discover your own ministry as a lay person. EFM groups consist of 6-12 lay people who commit to meet weekly between September and May. The heart of EFM is the weekly discussion in which participants wrestle with relating their faith to their daily lives. There is also some discussion of academic material.



EFM is a four-year program, but participants commit to only one year at a time. There are different academic materials for each year:

1. Year one students study the Old Testament, including the different source materials from which the Old Testament was derived, and the historical and cultural context of each book.
2. Year Two students get into the New Testament. Lessons cover historical and cultural background of the texts as well as the texts themselves.
3. Year Three students study Church History.
4. Year Four students explore theology in the modern world. There will be readings on ethics, on interacting with other religions, and on forming one's own theology.

Theological Reflection is a crucial part of EFM. Each week, we try to put our experience in conversation with the Christian tradition, to make sense of what our experience means in light of our faith, and to understand what unique calling there might be for each of us.

EFM is an extension course of the School of Theology of the University of the South. The cost is \$350 per year, and CEU credits are available. If you are interested, please contact Esther Harbert at eharbert@gmail.com.

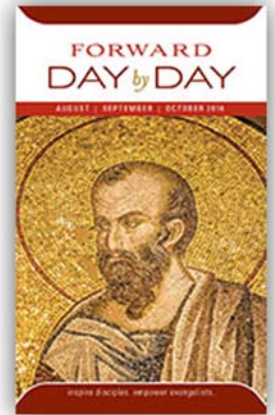

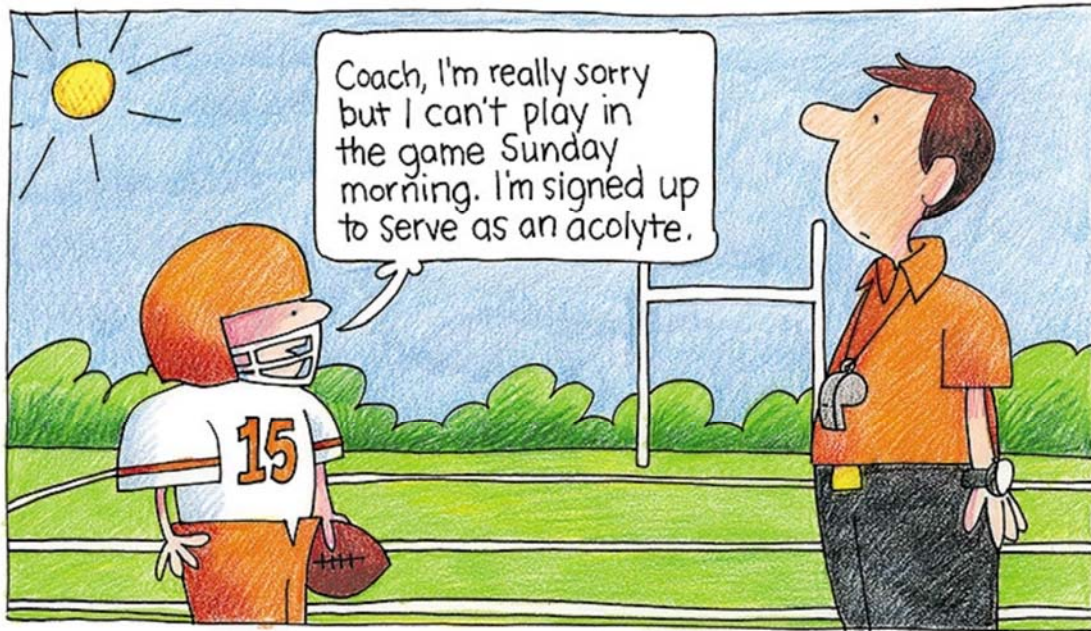
