### Heart stuff

If you haven't heard, this weekend The Episcopal Church is doing something new (and Lord, it is about time.) Tomorrow morning, Saturday, April 29, at 11 a.m., The Rev. Jennifer Baskerville-Burrows will be ordained as the first African American female bishop in our church in the Diocese of Indianapolis.

Bishop-Elect Baskerville-Burrows spent some time at Epiphany last year. She was then the Canon to the Ordinary for the bishop of Chicago. She and Bishop Lee came to Epiphany to meet with the Beloved Community for Dismantling Racism in the Diocese of Atlanta. We sat together in our parish hall and talked for 2 days about our work in Atlanta, and how we might support the struggling dismantling racism work in Chicago. They were here to learn from us.

This Fall, we will dissolve the Beloved Community for Dismantling Racism in the Diocese of Atlanta. No, sadly, it is not because we have finished our work. In fact, the commission's work will expand. We will soon announce the



opening of the Absalom Jones Center for Racial Healing, which will be located within the Atlanta University Center. This is a lifelong vision of the Dr. Catherine Meeks, and I will serve alongside her as we move forward with this work.

Many of you also know I have recently returned from Ghana on a pilgrimage of racial reconciliation with 9 other members of the Diocese of Atlanta, including our own Ann Fowler, and our Bishop, The Rt. Rev. Rob Wright. The purpose of that work was to form relationships with those in the Anglican Communion in West Africa, and work toward remembering our history around the awful legacy of slavery, and how it affects us all today. One hope from the trip is to official establish a companion relationship with the Anglican Diocese of Cape Coast as we move forward in our work of reconciliation. That trip changed me. In profound and simple ways. The people changed me. Relationships changed me.

My heart is full today for many reasons. Part of it is the ceiling breaking events for our church, for Bishop-Elect Baskerville-Burrows, and for African-American women in particular. Please hold her in your prayers for the days and weeks ahead as she truly walks a new path no one has walked before. My heart is full because of the good work happening in Atlanta around dismantling racism. My heart is full because Epiphany is a place we can exercise our hearts yearnings, where we can find our place, where our hearts are encouraged to expand.

My first sabbatical stop will be to spend a week with two amazing women priests. The three of us were in seminary together and celebrate our 10 year graduation anniversary this May. It will be good to be with them, to talk about what stirs my heart to hear what stirs theirs too.

Remember that life is short, and we do not have much time to gladden the HEARTS of those who travel with us. So be swift to LOVE. Make haste to be KIND.

## Sages



# Looking for a way to plug into service?

The Peachtree Pine outreach ministry involves several overlapping teams: people who chop and prepare for the big cook, people who cook, people who serve food at the shelter, people who prepare the meal for the volunteers, and people who clean-up. The end result is a monthly meal for 240-470 homeless people, depending on the weather. Teams always welcome new members.

Currently we have a <u>particular need for people to prepare</u> a <u>main dish for the volunteers' dinner</u>. This involves preparing a main dish for approximately <u>30 people</u>, with <u>expenses reimbursed</u> from the collection taken up at the volunteers' dinner (\$5 per person). (If the main dish is secured, it is easier to supplement appetizer/salad/veggie/bread/dessert from among participants). 
# Holy Comforter Seedtime and Harvest Garden and Greenhouse
