But, so and herewith I am going to simply point to leviathan again because now and again I see Leviathan all over again and I want to share a glimpse for your summer contemplation, as you travel, get married, change jobs, bury the dead, raise your children, sit in the backyard and think.

Leviathan, again. Leviathan showed up in the snow in Wyoming. Driving over the pass into the Teton's it snowed. Scared me half to death. Didn't think we were prepared for snow coats, bags, tent shoes? We were on summer vacation not winter!

Leviathan skipping across a grave. We Buried Denis's ashes in a cemetery. He's been dead for a couple of months and there we were again, his family and children. Kids doing what kids do around a grave, holding grief lightly because somehow in their bones they know this is not the last time.

Leviathan was hovering in the space between the flag and the coffin holding the body of Mr. Kilday. He was a vet—marine—world war II.

Leviathan in my brother's laugh, my brother who is crippled by disease and the misfortune of the struggle, laughing at the absurdity of finding a way for me to carry him through the mountains, imagining a path for us to share the space, the beauty of a life outside.

Leviathan growing up. A road trip before the boy gets too much older, too much more a young man instead of a young boy and celebrating, weeping at the gift and the loss.

Epiphany's Expenses Don't Take A Vacation

Memorial Day, School's Out for the Summer, Choir Break, Sunday School Hiatus, Vacation Bible School, 6 Flags, Concerts, the Pool, Ball Games, Picnics, Road Trips, Reunions, 4th of July, getting ready for school to crank back up. That's just a partial list of the stuff of our lives this time of year. While all this seasonal "stuff" is happening, Epiphany's finances don't get much of a break. Those pesky clergy and staff salaries, utility bills, mortgage payments, and diocesan pledge payments keep having to be paid, even during the doldrums and dog days of Summer.

As of the end of May, Epiphany has collected \$250,535 in income, primarily from your operating pledges as well as from your non-pledge contributions. However, we have spent \$287,729 so far this year. That means we've spent \$37,194 (our current deficit) more than we've taken in. So far this year we have received about 36% of total revenue projected in our 2017 annual budget.

Updated pledge statements will be available shortly after the end of June. Please review your statement and continue to keep your pledge up to date. Your generosity makes all that is Epiphany possible.

Shima' soap for sale at Breakfast on June 25

The ECW is sponsoring a breakfast on June 25th. Please join us for fellowship and a hearty meal.

We will also be selling Shima' soap to help fund the youth pilgrimage to Navajoland. The soap is from our former Associate Rector, The Rev. Cynthia Hizer. Cynthia is now in charge of the Good Shepherd Mission at Navajoland at Fort Defiance, Arizona. With a grant from United Thank Offering (UTO), Cynthia works with the women of the mission to grow Blue Corn. The corn and other herbs they grow are used to make the soap. We have acquired four kinds of the soap: Blue Corn, Grandmother Mountain, Navaho Tea and Mint Clan.

From their site at shima-of-navajoland.myshopify.com:

Shima' is our Mother, Earth created in Beauty, who guides and infuses life. The whole of the land and sky - Beauty in Four Directions - the life-force at the heart of our work: This is Shima'.

In Tse'hootsooi—the valley between the mountains—SHIMA' is a creative sanctuary. We are artists at 7200 feet, on the Colorado Plateau of northern Arizona, between the four sacred mountains, in the heart of Navajoland. Like our ancestors, we gather local sacred plants—corn, sage, cedar, Navajo tea—and infuse their Shima' vitality.

Altar Arrangements & Sanctuary Light

Altar Flowers

Each Sunday, with the exception of Lent, flowers are placed on the high altar area. There are occasions when the church takes on a more festive look such as Christmas and Easter. Flowers are offered "for the Glory of God and in thanksgiving or in memory of a person or event." Parishioners offer altar flowers as a visible sign of acknowledgement of God's presence in their lives. The color and selection of flowers is based on the appropriateness of the liturgical season. More than one person or family may sign up for the altar flowers during the same week.

Sanctuary Light

The Sanctuary Light is a visible sign of the presence of the Blessed Sacrament held in reserve in the Tabernacle. It is the tradition of our faith that parishioners make an offering to acknowledge the memory of a loved one in his or her life—especially appropriate during the week or day of an anniversary date of someone's death.

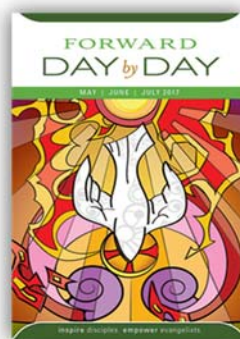
Tract Rack

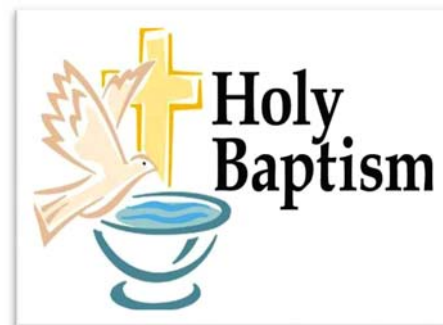
