Shrove Tuesday

I was talking to Shea today about 'what to write'. Of course she offered up the usual responses—Jesus!—the new online pay system—my upcoming trip to Haiti, s—holes redux (ha ha), Shrove Tuesday and Lent...

I've written about Shrove Tuesday so many jillions of times. I've written about all those other things about a jillion and a half times too. So, Shrove it is! Shrove is a past tense for Shrive which is to present yourself to a priest for sentence of penance, which of course requires you to confess, can't really have one without the other.

So, who is up? Any takers? Not so much? Yeah, every year we offer 'confession' as part of our Lenten/Holy Week enterprise and we never have many takers. It's just not much of our tradition, that confession and penance. What to do?

I want to suggest a path towards opening your awareness to the ongoing dynamic of sin/repentance/penance.

It starts with a definition of sin that can carry us through the day. It's the demystifying of sin. If sin is simply 'missing the mark' then, well, I am doing it right now; as I live and breathe I will surely miss the mark with someone in this little essay. Perhaps a bunch. Hopefully not the whole lot of you!! It's perpetual—sin. Which means perhaps it's not this wretched, life ending, glutton for punishment dynamic that just might land you in the mouth of Satan. If all things come from God...then sin is just part and parcel of who we are. We miss the mark all the time. Here is the fun part.

If sin is missing the mark, God has so constructed us that with every breath, in every waking moment the moment is new and a fresh start, a resurrection, a turn of the earth, a star shine moonshine blink of the eye moment where you have your whole glorious spectacular new life to live right now—RIGHT NOW.

If this is sin and repentance then the penance is simply the Breathe in—Breathe out of your daily existence. Sin—Redemption all wrapped up in the body, in the cosmos, in the death and resurrection of Jesus in the in-take and exhalation of the world spinning round.

So, fellow Episcopalians who might never avail yourself of the services of your clergy in an act of confession, repentance and the acceptance of your penance, be at ease, your *shrove* is on, it's all over you as you move and live and breathe; you are all at once sinning, repenting, hopefully delightedly accepting the penance of living life to the fullest.

Weekday Worship

Tuesday Morning Eucharist is celebrated at 7 a.m. A group of men gathers for breakfast and discussion afterwards and typically are on their way to work by 8 a.m.

A Noonday healing service is offered on Wednesdays followed by Eucharist.



Altar Arrangements & Sanctuary Light

Altar Flowers

Each Sunday, with the exception of Lent, flowers are placed on the high altar area. There are occasions when the church takes on a more festive look such as Christmas and Easter. Flowers are offered 'for the Glory of God and in thanksgiving or in memory of a person or event.' Parishioners offer altar flowers as a visible sign of acknowledgement of God's presence in their lives. The color and selection of flowers is based on the appropriateness of the liturgical season. More than one person or family may sign up for the altar flowers during the same week.

Sanctuary Light

The Sanctuary Light is a visible sign of the presence of the Blessed Sacrament held in reserve in the Tabernacle. It is the tradition of our faith that parishioners make an offering to acknowledge the memory of a loved one in his or her life—especially appropriate during the week or day of an anniversary date of someone's death.

Ways to Give

Here are all the ways in which you are able to give funds to Epiphany, including our new online giving options:

Cash or Personal Check

You can continue to give by cash or check during our worship services. Please make checks out to 'Church of the Epiphany' and take care to note in the memo field what the check is for.

If you are giving cash, please make sure to use a contribution envelope so that

we can acknowledge your gift in your contribution statement. Envelopes can be found in the tract racks by the front door.

Bill Pay

Contact your bank and let them know that you would like to set up a recurring payment to The Episcopal Church of the Epiphany. You will need to provide them with the amount, our address, and the date(s) in which you would like these payments made. A check will be automatically drafted to Epiphany from your bank.



Online

Online Giving through the use of a credit card, debit card, or by electronic debit from your checking or savings account is now available on Access ACS. Access ACS is a restricted, online version of our church database. Donor information is kept secure and private with password-protected online access.

Anyone can give one-time donations to specific causes or ministries, and church members can set up recurring donations, including your annual pledge, in personalized increments (e.g. weekly, bi-monthly, monthly) by logging into Access ACS and choosing 'Give Now.'

The online giving system is linked to our church accounting software, so you can view transaction histories whenever you login; however, note that our bookkeeper posts these transactions weekly. You will also continue to receive quarterly and end of year statements. First time users of Access ACS will need to register.

Text to Give

You can text to give from your mobile device. Text GIVE2COE to 73256 to give via text. You can add the dollar amount to your text or type it in once you're connected. Example: "GIVE2COE \$50" indicates you wish to make a \$50 gift. You will receive a response with a link to a secure page online to complete your gift. First time texters must confirm their account and payment method, then follow the text prompts to completion. Standard text messaging rates may apply.

Stock Transfer

Parishioners may wish to make tax deductible donations of appreciated securities to Epiphany. This form of giving offers several tax benefits to the donor. In this situation, Epiphany receives the full value of the securities less commissions and fees at the time of the donation, and the donor avoids paying capital gains tax that would otherwise be incurred if the securities were sold for cash. Planned Giving

Planned giving is a term that describes the thoughtful designation of a gift that will be made some time in the future, usually at the end of the donor's life. Planned gifts offer a way for Epiphany to address needs beyond those contained in the annual budget. When members remember Epiphany in their wills, trusts, retirement accounts, life insurance designations, or other assets, they are providing support to Epiphany's mission and ministries in the future.

Endowment Board Grants

The 30-day period for requesting disbursements from the Epiphany Endowment Fund opens on the day of the annual parish meeting, January 21, 2018. The guidelines for distributions, pursuant to the Fund's Plan of Operation, are:

- Capital improvements, debt reduction, or the building program of The Church of the Epiphany;
- Scholarships or grants to members of The Church of the Epiphany for the purpose of attending college, seminary, nursing or medical school; for church-related camping or leadership conferences; or such other training which enables members of this congregation to grow in Christian faith and service to God's people;
- Outreach into the community including, but not limited to, grants to Episcopal colleges and seminaries, social service agencies, institutions and agencies to which this parish relates, and to special programs designed for those persons in our area who are in spiritual and/or economic need; projects of the Episcopal Church at home and overseas.

Request forms will be available in the gallery or on the Endowment Board page of the Epiphany website. Deadline for Applications is Wednesday, February 21, 2018. Please return them to the cubby marked Grant Applications outside the parish office.

Quilters Dozen Starting



go our ways. Committee Chairs, please be sure to let your committees know each month if they are meeting.



Pub Theology




In Kay's own words


