We are all invited to many things on, it seems, an almost constant basis. Just in the last month I have been invited to three baby showers! (Who says that population growth is down?!) Each of these showers was an opportunity to share in the excitement, joy, newness, of a little one coming into our lives. Our invitations are many, some we eagerly say yes to, some we decline with sadness and some, whew...we are already booked. But the invitation to join Epiphany is an altogether different kind of invitation.

When Peggy and I moved to Atlanta 10 years ago from DC, we began the search for a new church and faith community. We attended probably 5 or 6 Episcopal churches around the area. I can honestly say that we were underwhelmed by the lack of invitation. There was seldom anyone posted at the front door with a big "Welcome. Glad you are here"! We frankly saved Epiphany for last as we had just left the Church of the Epiphany in DC and it just seemed a bit weird. But after a genuine lack of enthusiasm for the churches we had visited and Peggy's suggestion that we (gasp) visit a Methodist church, I was ready to dig in and find the place for us.



As we entered the red doors, I immediately felt a sense of peace. I loved the look, I loved the preaching, I loved all the folks who came up to us and said, Welcome! Are you new? Can we help you find your way around? It was the kind of welcome that all of us want when we go someplace that's new, unfamiliar, and maybe a little intimidating.

Eventually we accepted the Invitation to join. We were delighted to be asked. This invitation isn't like the other ones we receive daily through cards, emails, evites, etc. This is an invitation to be a part of a faith community that actively practices what it preaches. We believe in inclusion, we believe in the Bible's admonition "To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." Our community at Epiphany is special. We actively care for each other, we ask how are you doing, and really want to know the answer.

And like all communities, Epiphany can be a bit messy. Do we all agree on everything...oh come on you know the answer to that. We criticize, we argue, we get our feelings hurt, we rejoice, we sing, we pray. We are a family, but a family that always has room for more.

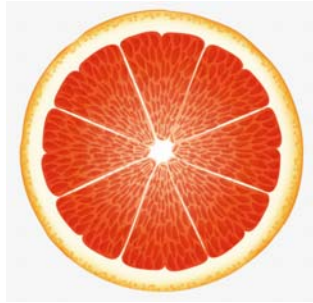

This usually takes two hours, from 6 - 8 p.m. Meals are typically for 20-25 people, but do not need to be elaborate. We will make sure that there are two households to cover each dinner, so you can enjoy getting to know Epiphanites better or serving with your friends.

Feeding Ministry

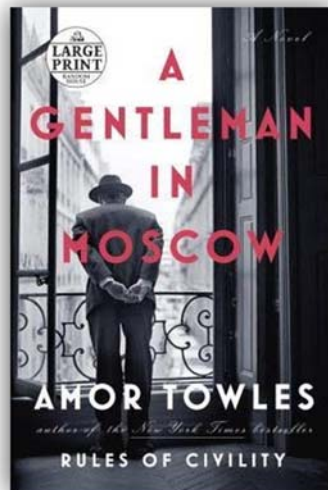
