Migrations

We move. From environment to environment, ecosystem to ecosystem in search of food, shelter, wellbeing; the basic necessities.

Our youth pilgrims will trace a part of the journey of the Great Migration: the exodus of the black population from the south to the north and west (mostly north). This demographic of humans, in this case black southerners, former slaves and heirs of that wretched legacy needed to move, the impetus was simply survival. Economic, social, spiritual, practical, bodily survival, were all at risk during this era of human migration. Jim Crow laws, the mechanization of agricultural labor, the systemic disenfranchisement of black people from civic and political and judicial recourse all played their hand to create the impetus to move. We share this with other animal species, this capacity to move when threatened.

It is a deep historical moment we will open up on our journey. It is a raw current moment that we must acknowledge is so undone in our communal life as Americans. Race still matters, boy does it matter.

Sometimes human beings move with great care, at other moments it is life and death, you grab whom you love and run. In our case we will retrace the path some took with great haste. We, on the other hand have time to consider. So, some considerations as we move.

One, we are inviting anyone who wants to see us off on the journey to the Absalom Jones Center for Racial Healing to celebrate a Eucharist on Monday, July 16 at 8:30 a.m. From there you can continue with us to Selma, Alabama to stand in one of the many places of reckoning in our history of racism in America—a place of movement and seeking, of risk, bravery and solidarity.

Beyond that our pilgrims invite you to pray with them as they go. We will turn north and make our way to Chicago to explore the fulfilled and unfulfilled promise of a different place, a new land, a different environment.

Many of you are sharing stories and experiences and material that will be helpful to us on our journey. Please continue to do so all of it is valuable and rich. Move with us as we go, move your heart and mind to God and ask for safe journey. Move your heart and mind to us that we might imagine more, breathe different air, and see God in the face of those we encounter along the way. Move your will that we might undertake the very difficult task of learning about our history, learning about our present and learning about how we might change tomorrow or the next day—will it for us.

Thank you for joining us. I hope many of you might make your way to the chapel on the 16th of July and at least some join us on our way to Alabama.

Capital Campaign Corner

May 2018 Update

In March of this year, Katie Pedersen represented Epiphany at the monthly meeting of the DeKalb County Historic Preservation Commission (HPC). Katie was able to secure approval of the Byrd House demolition pending approval of a campus landscape plan. She then coordinated with our partners at Breedlove Land Planning to ensure our campus landscape plan was congruous with the Druid Hills Historic Preservation Guidelines.

On May 21, 2018, Katie, along with Alan Wieczynski from Breedlove, returned to the HPC monthly meeting to present the final campus landscape plan. Thanks to their diligent efforts, Epiphany now has the required Certificate of Appropriateness needed to apply for demolition.

For the demolition permit itself, we are required to submit the following documents:

- Permit Application
- Permit Application Checklist
- Demolition Drawings
- Asbestos Survey and Surveyor’s Certification
- Rodent Letter
- Certificate of Appropriateness, including Approval of Campus Landscape Plan

These documents will be submitted to DeKalb County by the end of May, with the hopes of receiving the demolition permit by the end of June.


Building & Grounds Planning Meeting

Quilters Dozen Continues

Fabrics, needles, rotary cutters, ironing boards, and community. If you look in the corner of the Parish Hall on Wednesday evenings, you'll see it too. Twelve of us took on a Lenten practice to create a Books-of-the-Bible (BOTB) quilt. Master quilters gave of their talents to the novices, and each of us made six 6" blocks, give or take. One each week until all 73 books are complete. We will then piece the blocks together to form the quilt top. Then we sandwich the layers together and do the old-timey quilting bee task of actually quilting (sewing) the layers together.

I'd like to thank my friends who were daring enough to try this exercise: Janet, Rachelle, Terry-Lee, Shirley, Michelle, Tracey, Sara, Joy, Lane, Laura, and Cristin (the poster child of quilting who knew zero about quilting, yet faithfully and

gracefully finished her six blocks). A few more people stepped in just when they were needed ... Linda, Sam, Alix, and Mary Ann. Thank you.

Even though the BOTB quilt is not completed, we are moving forward with another quilt: the Women of the Bible (WOTB). It differs from the BOTB in color, block dimension, and piecing. It will have some unifying aspects so the two quilts can be hung together. If you would like to try your hand at this (like Barbara and Kimberly), I invite you to meet with one of us and sign out a block on Wednesday the 9th or 16th, or any Sunday. The quilts will be set up at my house in Stockbridge after Pentecost. All abilities, ages, and genders welcome.


Epiphany's Art Ministry is very excited to welcome artwork by Epiphany's own Terry Howell for May 2018.

Altar Arrangements & Sanctuary Light

Altar Flowers

Each Sunday, with the exception of Lent, flowers are placed on the high altar area. There are occasions when the church takes on a more festive look such as Christmas and Easter. Flowers are offered “for the Glory of God and in thanksgiving or in memory of a person or event.” Parishioners offer altar flowers as a visible sign of acknowledgement of God’s presence in their lives. The color and selection of flowers is based on the appropriateness of the liturgical season. More than one person or family may sign up for the altar flowers during the same week.



Sanctuary Light

The Sanctuary Light is a visible sign of the presence of the Blessed Sacrament held in reserve in the Tabernacle. It is the tradition of our faith that parishioners make an offering to acknowledge the memory of a loved one in his or her life—especially appropriate during the week or day of an anniversary date of someone’s death.

Pub Theology Tuesdays






